- Backpacks for Kids is a program supported by donations and a budget item for our PAT organization. DMJHS
 Student Council sponsors a food drive to help fill the shelves with food items. Backpacks are provided for
 students each Friday to have food for the weekend. They are also provided during Thanksgiving, Christmas
 and Spring Break holidays.
- Junior Auxiliary of Jonesboro partners with DMJHS to provide large item needs for our students who may have lost their home, parent/guardian death
- School supplies are provided through Stuff the Bus, Valley View Church of Christ, PAT, Arkansas State University
- Wish List Program-anonymous student profiles are created for those students in need at Christmas including clothing, toys, supplies, toiletries. Parents and organizations select a profile and provide Christmas using the profile.
- Nationwide Insurance of Jonesboro provides a Thanksgiving meal and food for the entire Thanksgiving break for students who are on a compiled list but together by our school counselors.
- Dillard's Department Store provides clothing, shoes and jewelry for students who are elected by the student body to serve on the Snowball court.
- Student physicals are provided free of charge in April by Arkansas State University and St. Bernard's Regional Medical Center

- DMJHS School Nurse provides a list of students in need of glasses after the hearing and vision screening to the Brandon Burlsworth Foundation. Each student name submitted is provided glasses through this foundation.
- Flu shots are offered free of charge by the Arkansas Health Department to the students and staff of DMJHS.
- Band students have scholarships provided by community stakeholders through the efforts of our band director, Seth Jansen.
- Community donations are provided across our campus for students in need. DMJHS staff, counselors, nurse, etc. reach out across the community and seek help where and when needed. Our community is there to give to any need asked for the students of DMJHS.
- Parent Center
- PAT is an organization made up of DMJHS parents supporting programs, academics and activities for all DMJHS stakeholders.
