CELL PHONE POLICY

The Jonesboro School District is implementing a **NO PHONE** policy for students. Students will not be allowed to have their cell phones out at any time throughout the day. Students will be allowed to have their cell phones when the dismissal bell rings. Phones are available in the office for student use, if needed. Please support us in this effort to increase student engagement, decrease distractions, improve the mental health of our students, and focus on learning.

DROP OFF AND PICK UP

- Students may enter the school building at 7:00 a.m.
- 7th grade students will go straight to the cafeteria upon arrival. 8th and 9th grade students will go to the gym.
- Students will be dismissed from the cafeteria and gym at 7:43 a.m.
- The tardy bell rings at 7:50. Students must be in their first block classroom at 7:50 in order to not be counted tardy.
- First route buses will leave from the back parking lot. Second route bus riders will report to the cafeteria. (Please contact the front office or the district transportation department regarding bus information 870-933-5870)
- Car riders may be picked up in the circle drive at the front of the building or in the back parking lot by the gym. All car riders should be picked up by 3:15 p.m. Please follow the directions of the AC staff member on duty when dropping off and picking up students in the car line.

DRESS CODE

The complete Jonesboro School District dress code policy can be found under Policy 4.25 - Student Dress and Grooming in the JPS Student Handbook.

At Annie Camp Junior High, we would like to emphasize the following rules regarding dress code:

1. Students are not allowed to wear hats, hoods, bandanas, or any other type of headgear. This includes wearing the hood up on a hoodie sweatshirt.

- 2. Students are not allowed to wear loungewear, pajamas, house shoes, or blankets.
- 3. Shirts must be long enough to completely cover the midriff when arms are raised straight over the head.
- 4. Shorts may not be shorter than four inches above the knee.
- 5. Pants may not have any holes or rips that show skin higher than four inches above the knee.
- 6. No spandex shorts or shirts. If wearing spandex leggings, a garment must be worn over the leggings that is no less than four inches above the knee.
- 7. All pants, shorts, etc. must be worn at the waistline.
- 8. Students may not wear any shirts or dresses that show a bare back or bare midriff.
- 9. Clothing may not display any inappropriate slogans, images, or language.

Failure to comply with the dress code will result in the student being asked to call home and have dress-code compliant clothing brought to them. If that is not an option, the student will be given clothing to wear that meets the dress code. Consistent dress code violations will result in assignment to in-school suspension.

BREAKFAST & LUNCH

All students are eligible to receive free breakfast and lunch. Breakfast will be offered everyday during first block classes. Lunch is served in the cafeteria and students eat with their grade level. Students are not allowed to have food delivered to school through a delivery service. Students may wish to bring a refillable water bottle to school to keep with them throughout the day.

AC CLEARINGHOUSE

In order to encourage the positive behaviors that are expected of Annie Camp students, we have implemented a program called the AC Clearinghouse. This program is used to determine a student's eligibility to participate in certain activities and to attend certain school-related events, such as ballgames and dances. The Clearinghouse is fluid, and a student's name can be added and removed throughout the school year. If a teacher or administrator puts a student's name on the Clearinghouse, that does not mean that the student's name will be on there for the whole school year. Some reasons a student's name would be put on the Clearinghouse include:

- Lack of academic effort
- Office referral
- Lunch detention
- Tardy detention
- Less than 85% attendance rate
- ISS Assignment

TARDIES AND ATTENDANCE

Tardies are disruptive to the learning environment and result in students missing essential learning time. The bell schedule allows a sufficient amount of time for students to get from one class to another. The first tardy bell rings at 7:50 a.m. **Students must be in their first class at**7:50 in order to not be counted tardy. Consistent tardiness can result in after-school detention and/or in-school suspension. Detention will be assigned after the 4th tardy. Tardies reset each quarter.

Attendance at school is a vital part of the learning process. We will continue the district-wide initiative to "Strive for Less Than Five" absences each semester. We understand that absences are sometimes unavoidable. For an excused absence, please send a note to school upon the student's return or email our attendance clerk at alexzandria.washington@jonesboroschools.net. Paper copies of a medical excuse can be turned in at the attendance office. Please refer to the student handbook for more details regarding the attendance policy.



CONTACT INFORMATION

It is VERY important that we have up-to-date contact information on file, as well as emergency contact information. Please make sure that your phone number, mailing address, and email address are all current. The majority of school communication is done through phone and email, and we want to make sure that all of our families are staying informed. STUDENT IDs

Students will be provided an ID badge & a lanyard during the first week of school. Students need to wear their IDs, so that their name, grade level, and picture are visible. IDs are used by the cafeteria staff when serving students breakfast and lunch. IDs are also used for entry to games and school events and for checking out books in the library. Please encourage your student to have their ID each day. The cost for a replacement ID is \$3.00.

<u>AC+</u>

AC+ is our building-wide Response to Intervention (RTI) time. On AC+ days, the daily schedule will be adjusted. AC+ is a designated time each week in which students receive content intervention and work on Lexia (our computer based reading skills program).
