Jonesboro is well known and admired for the quality of its education. We are proud of all of our schools! Children ages 4 & 5 are welcomed into our Pre-K. After Pre-K, the children transition to the Jonesboro Kindergarten Center and then to our Magnet Elementaries. Our Elementary Magnet schools consist of: Visual & Performing Arts; Math & Science; Health, Wellness & Environmental Studies; MicroSociety, and International Studies. Junior High students then transition to Annie Camp or MacArthur Jr. High School. The Academies at Jonesboro High School consists of three academies: STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math); HHS (Health and Human Services); and BCAL (Business, Communications, Art and Law). Our schools provide a quality instructional program which is designed to help each child reach his/her maximum potential. We have high expectations of ourselves and we extend these same expectations to you. In the Jonesboro School District, Excellence is our standard — not our goal — for every child.

GIFTED PROGRAMS

Jonesboro Public Schools offers the most comprehensive Advanced Placement (AP) and Honors courses in Craighead County and Northeast Arkansas. The Academies at Jonesboro High School offer AP in English Lang. Comp., English Lit., Psychology, Art History, Computer Science, Statistics, Calculus, World History, US History, Government, Macroeconomics, European History, Human Geography, Environmental Science, Biology, Physics, Chemistry, Spanish, Art, Music Theory, College Algebra, College Trig, and Freshman English Comp. Honors courses are offered in English 10, Algebra II, Pre-Cal/Trig., World History, Biology, Chemistry, Spanish, and Art. All teachers are required to be College Board certified.

Annie Camp and MacArthur Junior High Schools offer Honors courses in Math (Math 7, Algebra I and Geometry), Science, English, and Social Studies. All teachers are required to be College Board certified.

The elementary program, ACE (Accelerated and Creative Education) is a weekly pullout program for identified gifted students in grades 3 through 6. Students meet with a certified teacher of the gifted for two and one-half hours each week. All students in grades kindergarten through 2nd grade participate in a weekly 30 minute enrichment class taught by teachers certified in gifted education.

INSTRUCTION
